- Twenty-five civilians have been killed, and 26 injured, after a violent clash between two tribes in the state of West Kordofan
- The clash, which was initiated by a conflict between a farmer and a herdsman, resulted in the burning of several civilian homes, according to reports.

Activists warn of major civil unrest

- Humanitarian activists are warning of the development of widespread political instability in Sudan, speculating that the unrest could soon develop into the Sudanese equivalent to the Arab Spring, the “Sudanese Summer”.
- This speculation comes during three major conflicts in Sudan, as well as violent crackdowns on protests in late-August.
- Activists claim that the heavy government crackdown on critics and protestors indicates that Khartoum is wary of a possible uprising.
