Rapid Support Forces Arrive in South Darfur

- Rapid Support Forces, known locally as Janjaweed militia, have arrived in South Darfur, leading to fear amongst displaced persons in the region.
- The commander of the Rapid Support Forces claims their arrival in South Darfur is intended to help fight off armed opposition groups in the region.
- The paramilitary groups have already attacked villages, and there are reports that displaced persons have been beaten and robbed by the forces.

Rebel group calls for constitutional meetings

- The Sudan People’s Liberation Movement-North (SPLM-N) has called upon political forces in the country to meet in Addis Ababa to discuss a constitutional conference and the framework for a cessation of hostilities.
- The SPLM-N is also demanding legal recognition of their group as a political party, since their activities have been outlawed since 2011.
- This is in response to a draft framework agreement proposed by the African Union.
