UN Human Rights Expert Expresses Concern over Persecution of Baha'is at UN Human Rights Council

- Ahmed Shaheed, the UN Special Rapporteur on Human Rights in Iran, told the UN Human Rights Council that the Government of Iran continues to violate international legal standards, oppress women and persecute ethnic and religious minorities, including members of the Baha'i Faith.
- Ahmed Shaheed reported that hundreds of individuals remain in confinement for exercising their fundamental rights, including 136 Baha'is, 90 Sunni Muslims, 50 Christians, and 19 Dervish Muslims.
