- Secretary-General Ban Ki-moon warned the international community that security in northern Mali is deteriorating as a result of continued violence and increasing terrorist activity.
- Ban reported an increase in attacks by al-Qaeda directed towards U.N., French, and Malian forces.
- These attacks include the use of rockets and improvised explosive devices.
