Sudan criticized for expulsion of top UN official

- The United States government has criticized Khartoum’s treatment of international aid workers, following the expulsion of a top official from the United Nations Population Fund in Sudan.
- The head of the UN Population Fund’s office was expelled for “not abiding by the country’s laws and...interfering in the country’s domestic affairs in a manner that is inconsistent with her status as a UN official.”
- Sudan suspended the activities of the International Committee of the Red Cross in February.

- The Sudan Revolutionary Front are accusing Chad of deploying troops in North Darfur, as violence in the region continue to escalate.
- The rebel group says that Chadian troops are partly responsible for the region’s humanitarian crisis, and now claim that Chadian troops are assisting Sudanese forces.
- Sudanese forces in the region have been accused of attacking displaced person camps and targeting civilians in Darfur.
