Displaced persons attacked in Darfur

- A number of displaced persons in Sudan’s Darfur region are reporting beatings and robberies committed by government-backed militias in the area.
- Several displaced persons have also allegedly been held for ransom by the forces.
- UNAMID officials have accused the government-backed Rapid Support Forces, known locally as Janjaweed militia, as targeting civilian areas and displaced persons camps.

Sudan cracks down on pro-opposition students

- Sudan’s intelligence services has begun a massive arrest campaign targeting pro-opposition students as violence escalates at the University of Khartoum.
- A number of student activists and political leaders have been detained by Sudan’s National Intelligence and Security Services (NISS).
- Violence broke out earlier at the University of Khartoum after students supporting the ruling NCP attempted to forcibly remove pro-opposition students during a sit-in.
